HICKMAN PROMISES TO FOCUS ON RUNNING SUCCESSFUL ELECTIONS

Clint Hickman, the newly-elected Chairman of the Maricopa County Board of Supervisors, says county government's job in the coming year will be to make Maricopa County a place "where prosperity lasts and democracy flourishes." At the annual "Passing of the Gavel" ceremony, Hickman said his primary focus will be on the 2020 election cycle.

"The integrity and success of our elections is my #1 priority in 2020," Hickman said. "Because of our partnership with the Recorder's Office, we will have bipartisan oversight of elections not seen in Maricopa County in more than 50 years. In addition, the Board has invested millions of dollars to make sure we have the right personnel and updated equipment to allow people to have the voting experience they want and deserve."

A new elections operations agreement between the Board of Supervisors and the Recorder's Office gives the Board

responsibility for election day activities, as outlined in state statute. Previously, the Board had delegated its election duties to the Recorder according to a 1955 charter. Another change this year: there's now an executive-level position inside the Elections Department reporting directly to the Board.

"When something happens, or there are key decision points, the Board needs to know about it, and our residents need to know about it," said Hickman. "Making sure people know what we're doing and why we're doing it is vitally important for our democracy, so we'll be holding more public meetings and releasing detailed plans to the public, as we did recently with the first-ever Election Day and Emergency Voting Plan."

Beyond elections, Hickman said he wants to build on momentum from previous years in creating an environment where businesses can grow and current and future residents can find good jobs. He listed among the successes a moratorium on government rules and regula-

tions; a training series for local merchants called "Vendor University"; and several programs and initiatives which provide second chances and job connections for incarcerated individuals.

"In total, we've been able to direct approximately \$1 million in federal workforce funds to job training efforts here in Maricopa County, which doesn't just help justice-involved individuals, it also helps the community," Hickman explained. "Fewer repeat offenders means lower jail costs. And more people with jobs means a stronger economy. All of it leads to safer communities."

Clint Hickman has served on the Board of Supervisors, representing District 4, since 2015. He was elected Chairman unanimously today by his colleagues and takes over for Bill Gates.



Centennial Logo Contest

In January of 1986 the Buckeye Centennial Commission advertised for entries in a Centennial Logo Contest. Fourteen entries were submitted for judging before the February 7, 1986 deadline. Three outstanding entries were chosen for final consideration. Presented here is the winning design chosen to be the Official Centennial Logo. The artist, Dick Heiden, shown at right accepting the logo belt buckle numbered 1, created a design which reflects both the contrast and sameness of the Buckeye Valley from 1888 to 1988. Though the timeless mountains haven't changed noticeably since our ancestors arrival, their dedicated efforts at bringing modern irrigation systems into the Buckeye Valley have turned raw desert land into an agricultural oasis which feeds and clothes hundreds of thousands of people each day. Dick's design also shows the entry of hi-tec industry, the Palo Verde Nuclear Generating residents and future generations too.

Experts agree that periods of economic downturn, or recessions, are unavoidable and often follow a period of market growth. However, experts also acknowledge that it is difficult to predict exactly when the next recession will begin.

HOW TO NAVIGATE EXPENSIVE CAR REPAIR BILLS

If you're like many Americans, your car is your lifeline. When it's in need of repair, being able to cough up the cash to keep it running is critical.

A new survey finds that U.S. consumers spent an average of nearly \$2,000 on vehicle repairs and maintenance in the last five years, with millennials and generation Z being hardest hit by the costs. The 2019 Ally Financial survey, conducted online by The Harris Poll, found that while adults 55 and older spent \$1,654 on average for vehicle maintenance and repairs in the past five years, millennials and generation Z paid an average of \$2,334 during the same timeframe.

Day 18

Love seeks to understand.

How blessed is the man who finds wisdom, and the man who gains understanding. - Proverbs 3:13.

We enjoy discovering as much as we can about the things we truly care about. If it's our favorite football team, we'll read any article that helps us keep up with how they're doing. If it's cooking, we'll check out those channels or Web sites that share the best grilling technique or dessert recipes. If there's a subject that appeals to us, we'll take notice any time it comes up. In fact, it naturally becomes our area of personal study.

It's fine, of course, to have various interests and become knowledgeable about specific areas of preference. But this is where love would ask the question, "How much do you know about your mate?"

Think back to the days when you were courting. Didn't you study the one your heart was yearning for?

When a man is trying to win the heart of a woman, he studies her. He learns her likes, dislikes, habits, and hobbies. But after he wins her heart and marries her, he often stops learning about her. The mystery and challenge of knowing her seems less intriguing, and he finds his interests drifting to other areas.

This is also true in many cases for women, who start off admiring and building respect for the man they desire to be with. But after marriage, those feelings begin to fade as reality reveals that her "prince" is a flawed and imperfect man.

Yet there are many good things still to be discovered about your spouse. And this understanding will help draw you closer together. It can even give you favor in the eyes of your mate. "Good understanding produces favor" (Proverbs 13:15).

Consider the following perspective: if the amount you studied your spouse before marriage were equal to a high school diploma, then you should continue to learn about your mate until you gain a "college degree," a "master's degree," and ultimately a "doctorate degree." Think of it as a lifelong journey that draws your heart ever close to your mate.

- Do you know his or her greatest hopes and dreams?
- Do you fully understand how they prefer to give and receive love?
- Do you know what your spouse's greatest fears are and why they struggle with them?

Some of the problems you have in relating to your spouse are simply because you don't understand them. They probably react very differently to certain situations than you do, and you can't figure out why. These differences - even the ones that are relatively insignificant - can be the cause of many fights and conflicts in your marriage. That's because, as the Bible says, we tend to "revile" those things we don't understand (Jude 10).

There are reasons for his or her tastes and preferences. Each nuance in your spouse's character has a backstory. Each element of who he is, how he thinks, and what he's like is couched in a set of guiding principles, which often makes sense only to the person who holds them. But it's worth the time it will take to study why they are the way they are.

If you miss the level of intimacy you once shared with your spouse, one of the best ways to unlock their heart again is by making a commitment to know them. Study them. Read them like a book you're trying to understand. A treasure chest to be unlocked.

Ask questions. The Bible says, "The ear of the wise seeks knowledge" (Proverbs 18:15). Love takes the initiative to begin conversations. In order to get your

mate to open up, they need to know that your desire for understanding them is real and genuine.

Listen. "A fool does not delight in understanding, but only in revealing his own mind" (Proverbs 18:2). The goal of understanding your mate is to hear them, not merely to tell them what you think. Even if your spouse is not very talkative, love calls you to draw out the "deep water" that dwells within them. (Proverbs 20:5).

Ask God for discernment. "The Lord gives wisdom; from His mouth come knowledge and understanding" (Proverbs 2:6). Things like gender differences, family backgrounds, and varied life experiences can cloud your ability to know your mate's heart and motivations. But God is a giver of wisdom. He can show you what you need in order to know how to love your spouse better.

"By wisdom a house is built, and by understanding it is established; and by knowledge the rooms are filled with all precious and pleasant riches" (Proverbs 24:3-4). There is a depth of beauty and meaning inside your wife or husband that will amaze you as you discover more of it. Enter the mystery with expectation and enthusiasm. Desire to know this person even better than you do now. Make him or her your chosen field of study, and you will fill your home with the kind of riches only love can provide.

Prepare a special dinner at home, just for the two of you. The dinner can be as nice as you prefer. Focus this time on getting to know your spouse better, perhaps in areas you've rarely talked about. Determine to make it an enjoyable evening for you and your mate.

ARIZONA HISTORY: BUCKEYE CANAL AND LAND CO.

In facet, it catches the drainage of northern and northeastern Arizona, northwestern and western New Mexico and northeastern Sonora (Mexico). A vast territory larger than all the New England States."

He submitted an estimate of enlarging the canal to the Hassayampa. , a distance of 23.84 miles, building the dam, enlarging head gates, etc. at \$107,040.00.

The Major goes on and says, "I claim that the land under the Buckeye Canal is far ahead of the Salt River Valley, West of the Hassayampa water is near the surface and at aMullins Well only 4 ft from the surface. In section 17.21, 27 or 26. Township 1 north., Range 5 west. I have a fall for water power of 40 ft.

"I look at this place as far ahead of the section around Phoenix, as a fruit country, the soil is better, the altitude as good or better, no winters, and scarcely any frost, during the last two winters. This country would have been settled up long ago but for the Gila River washing out all the canals in 1883 and 1884 on account of their bad location and bad

construction."

After saying all these nice things about the country, he went on to say that a canal 48 miles long could be constructed for \$225,907.00 and it would cover 29,120 acres east of the Hassayampa and west 34,580 acres west of surveyed land and 48,000 acres of unsurveyed land making a total of 111,700 acres.,

In December 1888 and January 1889, William Barnes, president of the Buckeye Irrigation Co. and Charles N. Fowler, president of the Equitable Mortgage Co., of Kansas City entered into a verbal discussion in regards to providing the necessary money to finance the enlargement of the canal and a new and more substantial dam. The matter was brought before the Board of Directors of the mortgage company in Kansas City and a very lengthy letter was dispatched to Mr. Barnes on Jan 23, 1889. Some of the highlights of the letter follow. (It seems that irrigation bonds were something new at that time and the Irrigation Co. deal with the Union Trust Co. of New York had been called off hence this new attempt to get money to finance the canal enlargement.) Extracts from the letter follow: "Hon, William Barnes; we have certainly considered the

Buckeye Ditch matter and while we appreciate the intrinsic merit of the Bonds. we feel as though we should also recognize the fact that Bonds of their character are quite unusual and that it may be difficult to find purchasers for them. We of course must look upon them from the standpoint of sellers and compare them with other securities of equal or not with different merit, but about which the public is quite well informed.
